NJGPA Performance Levels

- March 2023 marked the second administration of the New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment (NJGPA).
- Statute requires the State graduation proficiency assessment to be administered to all 11th grade students to measure the extent to which students are graduation ready in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics.
- The content is aligned to the New Jersey Student Learning Standards (NJSLS) for ELA grade 10, Algebra 1 and Geometry.


NJGPA Performance Levels

- Not Yet Graduation Ready


Spring 2023 NJGPA English Language Arts District vs State

English Language Arts Proficiency




Spring 2022 & 2023 NJGPA English Language Arts District and State Growth

English Language Arts Proficiency




Spring 2023 NJGPA Mathematics District vs State






ACCESS for ELLs


- ACCESS for ELLs is a computer-based, adaptive, English language proficiency test administered to English Language Learners (ELLs) in Grades K-12.
- Each student's language is assessed in four domains: Listening, Reading, Speaking, Writing.
- A small percentage of students were administered the Alternate ACCESS for ELLs, an alternate assessment for students who are identified as English Language Learners (ELLs) with the most significant cognitive disabilities.

- 1 Entering: Knows and uses minimal social language and minimal academic language with visual and graphic support
- 2 Emerging: Knows and uses some social English and general academic language with visual and graphic support
- 3 Developing: Knows and uses social English and some specific academic language with visual and graphic support
- 4 Expanding: Knows and uses social English and some technical academic language
- **5 Bridging:** Knows and uses social and academic language working with grade level material
- **6 Reaching:** Knows and uses social and academic language at the highest level measured by this test









Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM)

Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM)

- Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) is an alternate assessment for students with the most significant intellectual disabilities.
- Students are tested in the content areas of English Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science.

DLM Proficiency Levels

Emerging- The student demonstrates emerging understanding of and ability to apply content knowledge and skills represented by the Essential Elements.


Approaching Target-The student's understanding of and ability to apply targeted content knowledge and skills represented by the Essential Elements is approaching the target.

At Target- The student's understanding of and ability to apply content knowledge and skills represented by the Essential Elements is at target.

Advanced- The student demonstrates advanced understanding of and ability to apply targeted content knowledge and skills represented by the Essential Elements.
